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Guy Mendilow Ensemble

The Guy Mendilow Ensemble (GME) is "an international tour de force" (Bethlehem Morning Call) from the Middle East, South and North America. GME combines world-class musicianship with cinematic storytelling in shows that "explode with artistry, refinement, and excitement" (Hebrew Union College), whisking audiences to distant times and picturesque places, conjuring voices lost to upheaval, to spark personal connections with stories of ordinary people living through extraordinary moments of change. Adding such visceral dimensions to tales of the long-ago-and-faraway, GME stirs resonant questions about our own struggles and dilemmas today.

GME's mission is to humanize historical experiences that may otherwise be distant, merely conceptual, or "other" through performances combining evocative music, stories and theatrical projections, and through robust educational offerings. The ensemble has performed in performing arts centers and cultural arts centers in urban, suburban and rural communities across North America. Guy Mendilow Ensemble distinguishes itself for the quality and impact of its programs for schools, universities and cultural organizations. Educational programming includes workshops, lectures, choral/string collaborations for school-age children, university students and adult populations, and teacher trainings.

In its stage shows for children, as well as workshops for music teachers, adult learners and school-age children. GME draws on expertise with principles of Dalcroze Education, a dynamic, full-bodied approach to training musicianship through purposeful movement in a celebratory, social atmosphere rich in improvisation.

GME's program design and implementation is guided by the company's core values: Contribution, excellence, deep listening, conversation and sustainable partnership.

WORLD CULTURES

Around the World in Song!

Through colorful songs, stories and games, the Guy Mendilow Ensemble transports families on an exhilarating interactive adventure through Ensemble members' diverse homes worldwide. In this highly musical, pedagogically-sound performance, families encounter vibrant characters and some of the band's most fascinating "star" instruments like overtone singing, the munnharpa (jaw harp) and musical bow and arrow. For virtual presentations at home, adult participation strongly encouraged to enable children to derive maximum benefit. Around the World in Song! can be presented as a single presentation or as a multi-day residency. A downloadable "Explorer's Guide" is included.

The Forgotten Kingdom

History and emotionality collide as *The Forgotten Kingdom* evokes a travelogue through an unraveling Mediterranean world at the turn of the 20th century, glimpsed in settings of Ottoman Sephardi women's songs portraying the visceral, personal experience of ordinary people caught up in revolutionary dramas.

Sand artist Kseniya Simonova creates, morphs and obliterates sand imagery, crafting flowing narratives and set-pieces for Guy Mendilow Ensemble's storytelling and music. The sweeping, cinematographic score draws on traditional tunes, techniques, and tales but in elegant arrangements and radical reframing. The bittersweet rawness of Tango, gorgeous vocal harmonies and the rhythmic fire of classical Arabic percussion intensifies the emotionality of Western classical music.

With lyrics in Ladino, an endangered blend of archaic Spanish, Turkish and Greek, and English narration, the stories and music render scenes of a culturally rich day-to-day Ottoman life from before WWI through the early 20th-century's violent population displacement and tearing-apart of communities.

In adventures that "explodes with artistry, refinement, and excitement," (Hebrew Union College, OH) *The Forgotten Kingdom* moves participants with questions about struggles we too face today.

The Forgotten Kingdom Classroom Lecture Series

Scenes from *The Forgotten Kingdom* are unpacked live according to themes preselected by artist, teachers and arts curators. Themes range from humanities/historical (e.g. relevance to current events including race in the US as viewed from the vantage of Ottoman immigrants) to musical/artistic subjects and questions of authenticity, responsibility and appropriation.

Overtone Singing 101

Overtone singing is a family of techniques allowing one person to sing two or more notes simultaneously. This workshop gives participants an overview of the most common overtone singing styles worldwide, an introduction to the physics of overtone singing and practical guidance so that you can sing your own overtones using "Western" overtone singing technique. Chalk full of demonstrations, fascinating background and group exercises. Presentation will included pre-recorded video and audio examples.

Listening to Lost Voices: Preservation vs. Distortion of Traditional Cultures

Today, we have unprecedented access to traditions from around the world, many of which are fading. Many artists are inspired by such art forms, and want to draw on them in their own work. This raises a host of questions about ethics and responsibility. How do modern creative navigate the dynamics of preservation, innovation, appropriation and cultural distortion?

This lecture traces changes in Ottoman Sephardic music caused by political, social and technological shifts as well as deliberate reinventions.

- Narrative intertwines with field recordings from Ottoman Sephardic enclaves and modern artistic interpretations to challenge participants to consider:
- What responsibilities do modern artists face when working with traditional material — especially from endangered cultures?
- What happens when culture bearers cannot live up to outsider's romanticized, exoticized expectations of what they are supposed to be?
- Who gains, and who loses, when traditional music is taken beyond traditional contexts?

CHARACTER BUILDING & INSPIRATION

StoryFire

Through storytelling, lyrics, recording and animation, *StoryFire* gives participants tools they can use to make their stories more resonant, speaking powerfully in both intellectual and emotional ways by making others who are different part of the story. *StoryFire* sparks vital opportunities for participants from different demographics to forge meaningful connections with through collaborative storytelling. In *StoryFire* residencies, students from different demographics, from one school create lyrics and direct the recording of those lyrics by a team of professional performing artists. The recording is then animated by a similarly aged cohort of students in a different community.

Throughout the process the students trade asynchronous video pen pal messages, building rapport with one another. Once the final project is complete, community presentations are scheduled, with opportunities for the students to meet one another synchronously in person or virtually. At these presentations, students are treated the same way a mainstage artist would be treated, complete with artist conversations in which the students share their experiences as well as a concluding reception.

The student guide includes printed information worksheets, lyric examples, audio links and teacher's guide with detailed lesson plans.

What sessions looks like

Interactive leadership and writing exercises, fueled by prerecorded multimedia performance, gets ideas churning and spark student storytelling. Students gain tools to draw others into their stories and make their pieces come alive in multi-sensorial ways. Student works are compiled into a final piece(s) which may be recorded by professional artists or performed live. When residencies include animation component, students' final work is animated by a cohort of similarly aged students at a different school. Throughout the process, students have opportunities to correspond.

Listening *Through* The Music Team Building through Improvisation

Exciting, quickly learned improv games give powerful tools to working with others: the abilities to tune in, connect, and respond spontaneously and meaningfully to one another. These games reset ordinary power dynamics, setting up cooperative models where every voice matters. Geared for mature students, music educators and classroom teachers, this experiential workshop builds teamwork and leadership through games in music and movement improvisation. Initially created for mediation organizations like Seeds of Peace, this workshop has been adapted for classrooms, choirs, theatrical casts and professional work environments. No previous musical or movement experience required. Participants should come ready to move and play. The participant packet includes detailed lesson plans and articles about the theory and methodology.
